### Travel & Accommodation Grants for IJP Fellows & Alumni

For the fourth time, fellows of current IJP bursaries and alumni of IJP are being offered the opportunity to apply for free participation in the 2017 Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings. The Council for the Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings will cover the travel and accommodation costs of up to 3 journalists per meeting:

- 67<sup>th</sup> Lindau Nobel Laureate Meeting (Chemistry) 25–30 June 2017
- 6<sup>th</sup> Lindau Meeting on Economic Sciences 22–26 August 2017

### Application Process

Only current and past fellows/alumni of the International Journalists' Programmes (IJP) are eligible to apply for the grants. A CV listing your professional experience and your current occupation as well as a letter of motivation stating your specific interest in the respective meeting and its participants are compulsory. In addition, please state the media outlet/platform which might publish your article/piece.

- The application deadline is 31 March 2017.
- All applicants will be notified of the results by early April 2017.

## The Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings

Dialogue between the luminaries of science and the next generation of top researchers has been at the centre of the Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings since 1951. On the occasion of the **67th Lindau Meeting** around 30 Nobel Laureates and 400 excellent young scientists from approximately 80 countries will come together in the Southern German town of Lindau – to share their knowledge and experiences, to gain inspiration and motivation, and to expand their contact networks. **This meeting is dedicated to the Nobel Prize discipline of chemistry.** Topics range from molecular nanotechnology to climate change and computing in chemistry. The programme of lectures, master classes, panel discussions and panels will be available by March/April 2017.

The **6th Lindau Meeting on Economic Sciences will be held in the same spirit** and take place by end of August. 20 Laureates of the Sveriges Riksbank Prize in Economic Sciences in Memory of Alfred Nobel will encounter around 400 aspiring young economists from all over the world. The anti-globalization backlash, inequality and economic sciences in a “post-truth” world will be intensively discussed. The programme will be available by May/June 2017.

The Lindau Meetings attract large interest, also among science journalists from around the globe: Every year, nearly 100 journalists from 30 countries register for accreditation with intent to cover the meeting. Accredited journalists have free access to all lectures and panel discussions of the programme. In addition, there will be plenty of opportunities for informal exchange with the meeting participants on the fringes of the sessions as well as during the social events. With the assistance of the organizers, journalists can take advantage of a variety of interview appointments with selected laureates, young meeting participants and guests.
