Travel & Accommodation Grants for IJP Fellows & Alumni

For the sixth time, fellows of current IJP bursaries and alumni of IJP are being offered the opportunity to apply for a grant to participate in the

70th Lindau Nobel Laureate Meeting (Interdisciplinary) 28 June – 3 July, 2020

The Council for the Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings will compensate an **accommodation for four nights and travelling costs** for up to 3 grant recipients.

Application Process

Only current fellows and alumni of the International Journalists' Programmes (IJP) are eligible to apply for these grants.

You are required to submit a letter of motivation stating:

- your specific interest in the meeting and its participants
- how you are planning to cover the meeting (the type and extent of work you will produce)
- the media outlet(s) where you will publish your articles/pieces
- the social media channels you will use for your coverage
- a CV listing your professional experience and your current position
- 2 – 3 samples of your work

The Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings

The dialogue between the luminaries of science and the next generation of top researchers has been at the centre of the Lindau Meetings since 1951.

On the occasion of the **70th Lindau Nobel Laureate Meeting** around 70 Nobel Laureates and more than 600 excelling young scientists from approximately 100 countries will come together in the southern German town of Lindau to share their knowledge and experiences, to gain inspiration and motivation and to expand their networks.

This meeting is dedicated to all natural science disciplines referring to Nobel Prizes. Key topics besides current research in Chemistry, Physiology or Medicine and Physics will include International Scientific Collaboration, Science after Brexit, Lindau Guidelines for Global, Sustainable and Open Science in the 21st Century and Communicating Climate Change.

The programme will consist of numerous lectures, panel discussions and Agora Talks. Accredited journalists have free access to all the events mentioned above. In addition, there will be plenty of opportunities for informal exchange with the meeting participants on the fringes of the sessions as well as during the social events. The organizers of the meeting can arrange interview appointments for journalists with laureates, young scientists and guests. The meeting programme will be available online from April 2020 on.

The Lindau Meetings attract a large interest among science journalists from around the world: Every year, nearly 100 journalists from 30 countries register for accreditation.
