### Travel & Accommodation Grants for IJP Fellows & Alumni

For the fifth time, fellows of current IJP bursaries and alumni of IJP are being offered the opportunity to apply for free participation in the

68<sup>th</sup> Lindau Nobel Laureate Meeting (Physiology or Medicine)

24–29 June 2018

The Council for the Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings will compensate **accommodation for four nights and transportation costs** of up to 3 grant recipients.

### Application Process

Only current and past fellows/alumni of the International Journalists' Programmes (IJP) are eligible to apply for the grants.

You are asked to submit:

- a letter of motivation stating:
- your specific interest in the meeting and its participants
- how you are planning to cover the meeting (the type and extent of the work you will produce)
- the media outlet(s) where you aim to publish your article/piece
- Plus: CV listing your professional experience and your current position
- 2 – 3 samples of your work

The application deadline is 31 March 2018. All applicants will be notified of the results by mid-April 2018.

## The Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings

Dialogue between the luminaries of science and the next generation of top researchers has been at the centre of the Lindau Meetings since 1951.

On the occasion of the **68<sup>th</sup> Lindau Nobel Laureate Meeting** around 40 Nobel Laureates and 600 excellent young scientists from approximately 80 countries will come together in the Southern German town of Lindau – to share their knowledge and experiences, to gain inspiration and motivation, and to expand their contact networks.

**This meeting is dedicated to physiology and medicine.** Key topics will include the circadian clock, genetic engineering, science in a post-factual era and science publishing. The programme will include numerous lectures, panel discussions, Agora Talks, master classes and a poster session. Accredited journalists have free access to all lectures, Agora Talks and panel discussions of the programme. In addition, there will be plenty of opportunities for informal exchange with the meeting participants on the fringes of the sessions as well as during the social events. The organizers of the meeting can arrange interview appointments for journalists with laureates, young scientists and guests. The meeting programme will be available online from April 2018.

The Lindau Meetings attract large interest, also among science journalists from around the globe: Every year, nearly 100 journalists from 30 countries register for accreditation with intent to cover the meeting.
